Reflections of an Itinerant Preacher i.e., A Word from the D.S.



Dear Friends,

In last month's Connector, I mentioned that I would write of my concerns about Christians and Christian churches, who are satisfied with "good enough", who strive to be merely "nice." As we approach Holy Week, and the day of Resurrection, however, I wondered about the appropriateness of this topic.

But not for long! There is little that is "merely nice", or simply "good enough" about these critical events in the history of the salvation of the world!

Consider: if Jesus had been focused on being nice, he would most certainly have avoided Jerusalem during Passover. The celebration of this holy time was volatile, for it reminded the Jews of the time when God challenged the powers that were for the sake of freedom on behalf of Egypt's slaves. Zealots were emboldened by the message, and that made the Roman authorities, and even the Jewish elite, nervous. When Jesus rode into the Holy City on a donkey, it was not so much an act of humility as it was a challenge to the way the powerful elite clung to their privilege. The crucifixion, of course, is all the evidence we need that Rome did not view what Jesus did as acts of humility and niceness.

And then there is the resurrection: there is nothing merely "good enough" about that, is there? The resurrection went far beyond a good faith effort on God's part to be "nice" to the world!

With this heritage, then, I have to keep reminding myself that God asks far more from me than to be merely nice, or simply good enough. The world will love me if I am merely nice, and will probably reward me if I am good enough. But God expects more from me. God expects from me passion for the Word, passion for all who have not heard about, or believed in Christ, passion for the good news – no, the spectacular, earth-

shaking, kingdom-toppling news that life and death, power and humility, wealth and poverty have been turned upside down.

God loves me, but is not particularly happy with me when I settle for being merely nice, or simply good enough. God has chosen me, and has equipped me for far more than that!

And God has chosen our pastors, our laity, our churches - AND has equipped them – for extraordinary, extravagant, hope-saturated acts of devotion to God and service to humankind.

Today, I invite all churches, all laity, and all pastors to join me in living into our salvation life by becoming extraordinary, extravagant, and hope-saturated workers in the vineyard.

Counselors Sought for Woodsmoke Events at Kingswood

Camp Kingswood, a 766 acre campground operated by the NYAC is located in Delaware County, New York approximately 150 miles northwest of New York City. During the weeks of July 19-25 and July 26-August 1 one week camping events known as “Woodsmoke” will provide small-group rustic camping experiences for up to forty boys and girls, ten each in four age-specific sites (youngsters entering grades 5-6, 7-8, 9-10, 11-12 in September).

Female and male counselors are needed to work with returning counselors in sites each week. Experienced program staff includes a Program Director, chaplain, nurse, lifeguards, and food service personnel. The 9-10 and 11-12 grade youngsters will participate in construction projects under skilled adult leadership.



Each Woodsmoke unit has two platform tents, one for boys and one for girls, with six beds apiece. Counselors may sleep in the tents or in separate dome tents pitched on the site. Counselors are expected to participate in an orientation/training event to be held on the site the weekend of either May 29-30 or June 5-6 that will be based in the Kingswood Farmhouse.

A \$300 stipend is available for each week served. In lieu of the stipend, that amount may be applied to the fee of a child enrolled in the program. Scholarship funds also are available.

SUMMER MISSION TRIP TO HENDERSON SETTLEMENT FRAKES, KENTUCKY

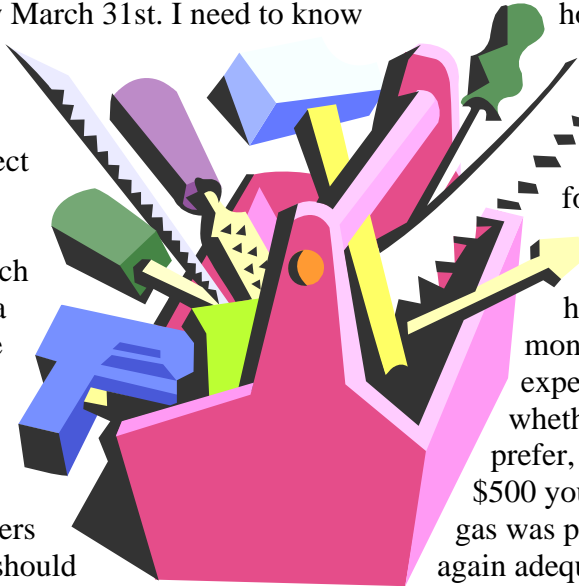

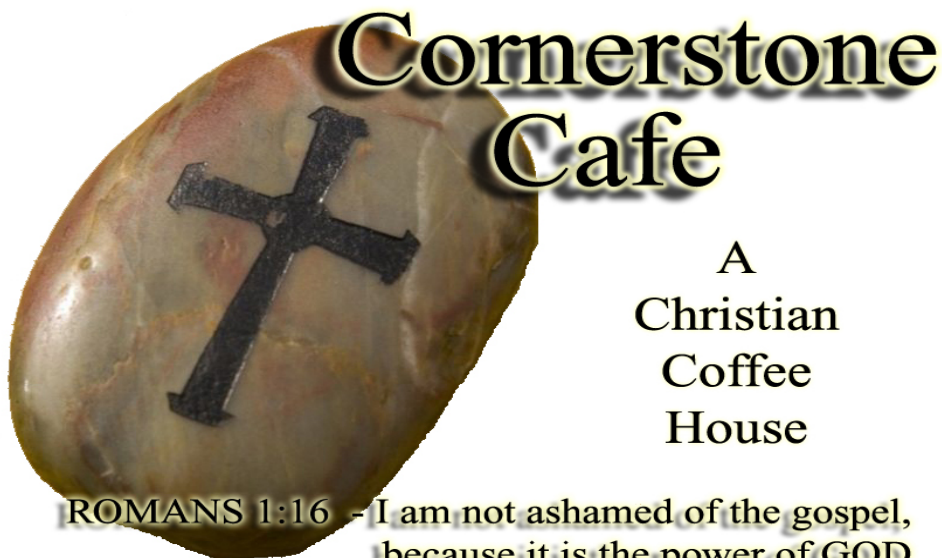
